Free limited access to JSTOR

JSTOR (short for Journal Storage) is an academic database comprised of articles on history, literature, economics and other areas of the humanities. With increasing [debate](#) over public access to tax funded research JStor now provides 3 free articles every 14 days. Printing isn't an option—neither is downloading (unless you choose to pay), but the process of creating an account is extremely simple. Click [here](#) for the page!

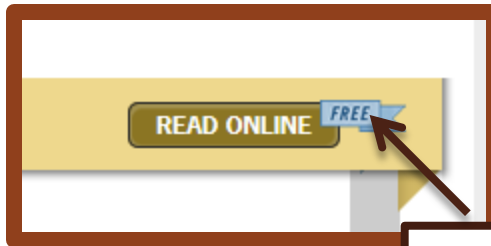

After doing a search look towards the top of the article preview page for this. Once you click it and add to your shelf select "go to item" to read in its entirety. Also, you can store as many citations as you like and when your shelf is clear after the 14 day period simply add another to read. And of course, the citation tools make doing bibliographies a breeze...
