State Bike Route 199

State Bike Route 199 is a signed, on-road bicycle route that extends from Dutchess to Ulster County. It begins at the intersection of Route 199 and Route 308 in the Town of Milan, Dutchess County, and follows Route 199 west over the Kingston-Rhinecliff Bridge to Ulster County. It connects State Bike Route 308 in the Town of Milan, Dutchess County, State Bike Route 9, in the Village of Red Hook, Dutchess County, and State Bike Route 32 in the Town of Ulster, Ulster County.
