Are you looking for a historical newspaper article, but don't have the time to go through reel after reel of microfilm? Depending on the dates you are interested in, you may be able to use the Poughkeepsie Public Library District's subscription to Newspapers.com to aid in your research.

Although home access is limited to PPLD cardholders, any Mid-Hudson Library System cardholder can visit the Adriaance Memorial Library or Boardman Road branch to utilize this database. Local papers include *The Poughkeepsie Journal* (1760-1906), *The Poughkeepsie Eagle News* (1861-1922), *The Middletown Times Herald* (1910-1947), and *The Kingston Daily Freeman* (1873-1977). In addition to these, Newspapers.com has over 90 historical newspapers from across New York State.

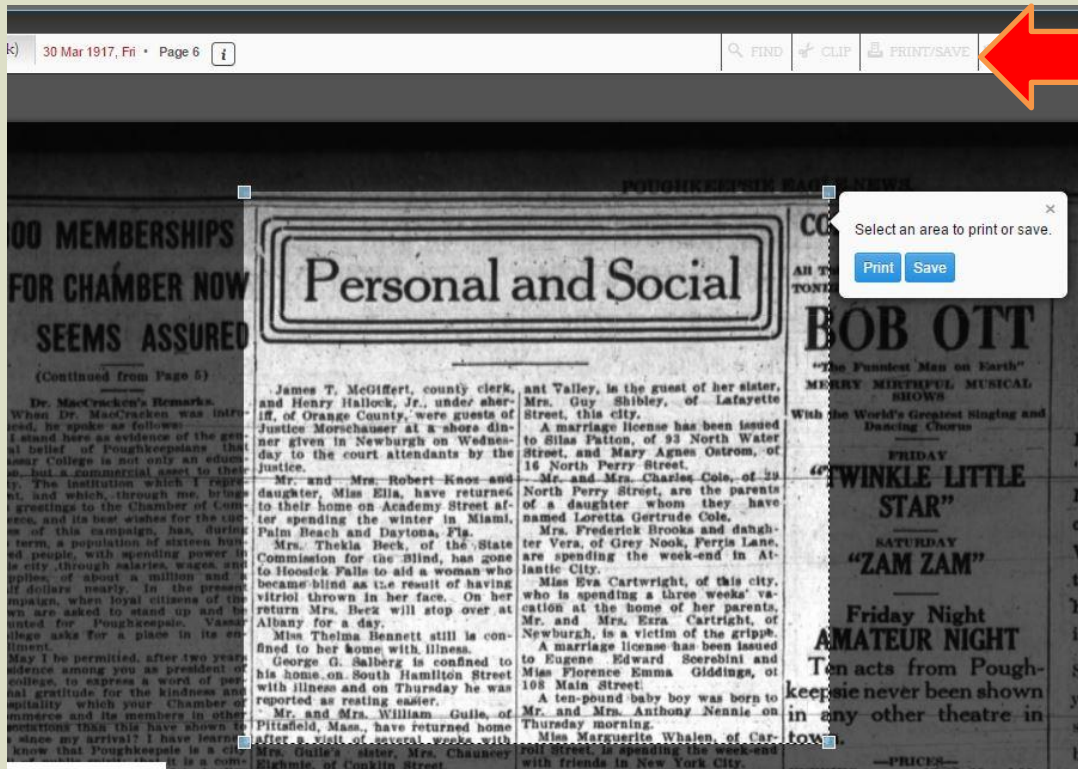
