



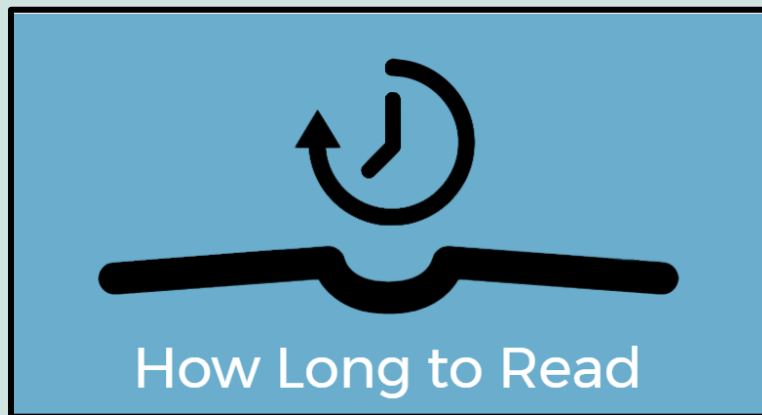

How Long To Read

[How Long To Read](#) allows user to find out how long it will take them to read a book based on their reading speed. The site offers a basic WPM (words per minute) test which will help estimate how long it will take them to read the text.



To find out how long it will take you to read **A Storm of Swords (A Song of Ice and Fire, Book 3)**, read the following sample paragraph and press to stop when you're done reading.

Heads up! Make sure to read the reading sample at the same speed as you would read a book, and not try to speedread. ×

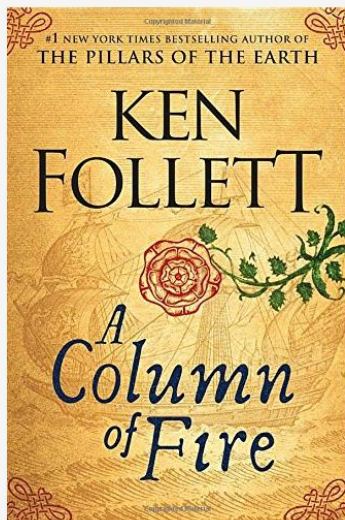
