Budgeting Apps

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It's never too late to work on your budgeting skills and now it's easier than ever with these handy and (mostly) free budgeting apps!

Mint



The most well-known and user friendly budgeting app, Mint has many features beyond just budgeting. Users can link up numerous accounts, including banking and bills, to get a well-rounded picture of one's cash flow. Users can set savings goals and customize their budgets, as well as keep track of upcoming bills and net income. This app is completely free.

Pocket Guard



This basic budgeting app lets users connect all of their financial accounts to help users track spending, bills, expenses, and savings. This app is completely free.

YouNeedABudget (YNAB)



This app will build a budget based on the user's income. This is a good app for those who tend to spend a lot of money on more frivolous purchases and need a reminder of where their money goes every month. Users can start a free 34-day trial but after that the app will charge \$7 a month (\$84 per year).

Wally



While not the most user friendly app, Wally is strictly for no-frills budgeting. It will help track income and spending but will also provide a snapshot of the users remaining budget to avoid overspending. This app is completely free.
