SOME IDEAS FOR «ENCOURAGING WRITING»



PLAYING CARDS

Make the writing exercise easier (while adding a twist) with some «cards» featuring characters, places, objects, etc. Distribute them randomly or have participants draw them, and let them imagine a story using the given elements.



THE NEVER-ENDING STORY

Select a story and print it using the Short Story Cube. Cut off the ending of the papyrus and let participants imagine and write their own endings. Then provide the missing part of the story so they can discover the ending imagined by the original author.



THE THEME

Choose a theme from which participants will create their stories! Monsters, The City, Setting Sail, Sneakers on Feet, In the Mist... even simple words can give birth to incredible narratives. You can also specify a genre: adventure, fairy tale, romance, poetry...

Have participants draw the comics using
a black pen or marker on A4 sheets. Each
comic should fit within a column of 7 cm
wide. Then scan each comic in good quality.

Authors submit their comics through the Short Story Portal. You can also add them directly from the Admin Portal.

When uploading the image for each comic, the cropping function will appear, allowing you to select only the 2.75 in column containing the comic.

SIMPLE AND EFFECTIVE LINES



The Short Story Cube's printer is small enough to fit in your hand, so the level of detail is limited. Thick black lines with high contrast ensure optimal print quality.

COMICS LONGER THAN AN A4 PAGE



If you feel restricted by US letter sheet,

you can scan two pages and assemble them using image editing software. Then upload the complete file to the Short Story Portal and crop it accordingly.

PREVIOUS WORK



While not mandatory, you may have created your comics using specialized software.

Similar to scanned comics, your files should be in JPEG or PNG format and have a good resolution (ideally, a minimum of 175 dpi). Keep in mind that proportions matter: just like drawing on paper, the final comic will be printed at 2.75 in wide with a maximum length of 39.37 in. Consider this when writing your speech bubbles. You can use a reference size of 800 px wide and a maximum length of 12000 px.

WORKING WITH ORAL SKILLS

Create learning situations that promote the development of oral skills using the Short Story Portal with the connection to the Cube. Whether in a school setting or in extracurricular activities, utilize the short stories provided by our editors to encourage children to express themselves orally by summarizing or giving their opinions on the texts.

Read stories aloud using techniques of oral presentation, focusing on posture, voice intonation, eye contact, etc. Teach readers how to capture the attention of the audience.

HOW TO GET STARTED?

From the Admin Portal, select the works you want to distribute for reading. You can either use the collections prepared by our editors or create a custom collection with the works of your choice.

2 Propose to the children to randomly choose printed stories.

Each child discovers their story and prepares a brief summary of a few sentences, which they then present to the class.



After the summary reading, each child gives their opinion on the story (without having written it). Did they like it? Why?

Once all the children have presented their stories, the one that was most appreciated can be worked on to be read aloud.



IMAGINING THE SEQUEL

Print the same story multiple times in papyrus format and cut off the ending. In groups, children must then imagine (without necessarily writing) the ending of the text. Each group orally tells the ending they have imagined to the rest of the participants. This exercise aims to show that imagination is as important as the way of storytelling, bringing a story to life orally.

GOING FURTHER

Working on oral skills takes time since each reader expresses themselves in front of others. This activity can be adapted based on the number of participants! There are numerous exercises related to texts that can be imagined. In addition to those proposed in the activity, here are two more examples.



DIALOGUE, A GATEWAY TO THEATRICAL PLAY

Some of the texts provided by our editors are particularly suitable for oral reading, especially those that contain a significant amount of dialogue. For example, «Ariane with the Golden Fingers» by Blandine Butelle, can be used to work on theatrical play and oral expression through a short scene.
