BIG READ FINALE: EVE OF REVOLUTION

The Losses and Services of the American Loyalist in Poughkeepsie

Tuesday, November 4, 6 pm, BRD

During the American Revolution, not everyone was a patriot. Poughkeepsie had its mix of patriots, loyalists, and people who simply didn't care either way. Those who decided to remain loyal to the crown were not always treated with the respect they once were. Join historian **Shannon Butler** as she presents her research on the small but active community of loyalists of Poughkeepsie. *Registration required*.

A Promised Land: Jewish Patriots, the American Revolution, and the Birth of Religious Freedom: Author Talk with Adam Jortner

Wednesday, November 5, 7 pm, Virtual

Jews played a critical role both in winning the Revolution and in defining the republic that was created from it. After the war, Jews began to press for full citizenship in the hope that liberty would apply to everyone. The founders, Jewish patriots, and their allies sought and achieved the broadest possible definition of religious liberty, and the separation of church and state. *Registration required*.

Liberty and Justice for Whom?: Stories of the Locally Enslaved in the American Revolution

The promise of liberty, based on the principle that all are created equal, was appealing. But during the Revolution, enslaved men, women, and children in Dutchess County at best found a mixed bag of success and setbacks. As **Bill Jeffway** discusses the stories of five individuals: Sophia Pooley, Andrew Frazier, Jacob Lyle, and two local men named Jack on opposite sides of the war, we come to understand the uncertainty of the American promise for the enslaved. *Registration required*.






Combining deep scholarship and serious whimsy, Barchas presents this literary icon as the starring character in her own


Jane Austen's *Sanditon:* From Unfinished Swan Song to British Costume Drama



Patrons need a Central Hudson account and to be an active Central Hudson customer.

For a limited time, upon return of the kit, patrons will receive a complimentary weatherization kit to help users get started on improving their home energy efficiency that includes: two cans of spray foam, door sweeps, five outlet gaskets, five switch gaskets, and one tube of caulk. The kit will help patrons seal drafts, improve comfort, and lower energy bills, particularly during peak summer and winter months.

"The Library District is happy to work with Central Hudson to better assist their customers with evaluating their home energy use," said Tom Lawrence, Director of PPLD. "It's the kind of collaboration that is of great benefit to the community.



Friends of PPLD Annual Meeting: When the World Changed: Dutchess County and the Day of Infamy with Jeffrey Urbin & Shannon Butler

On December 7, 1941, the US (ranked 17th in the world in military power at the time) was unexpectedly plunged into World War II, but what was the tone in Dutchess County?
